

Key Concepts and Skills

In Little Gems Class, we follow the Early Years Framework which as 7 subject areas, Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED), Literacy, Maths (Cognition), Expressive Arts and Understanding the World. Your children will experience a wide variety of lessons and activities which cover these areas. This half term, our topic is "The Gruffalo".

Home Learning Curriculum Ideas

Cognition and Maths

Use switch-activated devices to trigger Gruffalo sounds (growl, stomp). Encourage your child to press to make something happen.



PSED

Host a Gruffalo relaxation session: Play woodland sounds, dim lights, use lavender scent ("deep dark wood"), and soft textures for calm exploration. You could use some massage techniques, too.

Communication

For Communication you could make a create multi-sensory version of *The Gruffalo*. Include: Fur (soft fabric) for the Gruffalo's coat, scratchy pinecones for the forest floor, a damp cloth for the "deep, dark wood", orange peel (Gruffalo's eyes), jelly sweets or rubber for "wobbly knees"

Understanding the World

You could make a woodland exploration tray! A tuff tray with leaves, bark, pinecones, moss, and toy animals. Explore textures, smells, and temperatures while relating them to

the story.



Literacy

On a Monday morning, we visit our onsite train library, where your child will choose a book to take home that week and read at home. Please return your child's book bag, reading log and library book every Monday and will swap it.
