Key Concepts and Skills

Our topic this half term is a very exciting one - 'In Rehearsal', where we will be exploring a range of performances, such as circuses and stage plays! We will be exploring a personalised sensory story called 'Kedleston in the Castle' where we will encounter clowns, acrobats and the different smells and sights that often fill a circus tent. We will also be delving into the world of Scrooge in a Christmas Carol, in a more immersive and focused communication session. We will be engaging in the process of making mushy peas for Bonfire Night, and of course we will be getting creative with Christmas bakes and crafts! In cognition, we will be acting as music technicians with the CD player, and we will use the soundboards, continuing with the fantastic play and curiosity we demonstrated last half term, but this time with circus and winer props! We will have music lessons with Matthew every Monday afternoon and Rebound on a Monday morning.

Communication remains at the heart of all we do, and our pupils will have endless opportunities to tell us what they want and need by using TOBIs, symbols, switches and of course, their loud voices!

Home Learning Curriculum Ideas

Cognition/Communication

In Cognition, we are going to be using music as a motivator, pretending we are music technicians in a production!
