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Home Learning Curriculum Ideas

Cognition

Medieval armour would've made lots of noise, especially during fights!



Grab some pots, pans and spoons, and make your own Medieval jousting noise!



You can experiment with making louder and quieter sounds, and work on grasping those spoons!

You could also continue working with play dough, making bricks!


Reading
