Key Concepts and Skills

We will be exploring our new 'Rivers and Canals' topic through a range of activities! Our sensory story is based on 'Song of the River' by Joy Cowley, which takes us on a journey from river to the sea, where we will encounter lots of exciting smells, sounds and experiences! We will also be taking part in an immersive room session in small groups, which will be a more stripped back sensory story all about rivers, focusing on one sense at a time and really homing in on our communication skills! We will be exploring the process of the creation of a river in cognition, working on our fine motor skills in dough disco and through sand play, and we will have Music with Matthew every Monday!

Communication remains at the heart of all we do, and our pupils will have endless opportunities to tell us what they want and need by using TOBIs, symbols, switches and of course, their loud voices!

Home Learning Curriculum Ideas

Cognition

In Cognition, we are going to explore the process of how a river is created, and you can do this at home, too!

Explore the different elements one by one, slowly adding them

by one, slowly adding them together to make a river!

Sand...water...pebbles...toy fish/boats!

Then have fun splashing, pouring and playing!

Home Learning Curriculum Ideas

Kedleston Dough Disco Simple Plan

Focus on squeezing, rolling, flattening, feeling pressure in the palms of hands.

Will the your child touch the play dough with support?

Will they make independent movements with the dough in their hand?

Do they enjoy the pressure of the dough in the palms of their hands when squeezing?

Can they roll the dough into a sausage with support?

Fine Motor Action	Music
Rolling In palms of hands or on tray.	Rolling on the River - Tina Turner
Squeezing With support that can then be reduced.	Summer Paradise - Simple Plan
Pinching Some may be able to start to do this independently. Most might like if you put the dough in their hands and pinch it off.	Surfin' Bird - Trashmen
