Topics

Autumn I - Marvellous Mel

Children will develop their early inquiry skills by developing their understanding of themselves as unique individuals. Children start by learning about what makes them unique and special. Children move on to look at their physical features as well as their characteristics and personality. We will be looking at humans and learn the names of body parts. We then think about how each person is unique and valuable and consider religious beliefs about this. Children develop their knowledge of past, present and future in the context of their own personal history and that of their families. Children will share personal artefacts and those shared from their families to explore concepts of time, history and change. Finally, children will look at occasions marking belonging from a number of faiths, including welcoming ceremonies from Christianity and Islam. This paves the ways for children to start to think about festivals and celebrations.







Children will deepen their understanding of significance. We will look at events that are significant to them as well as those around them. We then focus on two events; one from the distant past and one from within the families living memory — Bonfire Night and Remembrance. They explore a range of ways in which these stories can be communicated e.g. through photographs, artefacts, books, oral histories and digital media. This topic is continued throughout the year in relation to festivals such as Christmas, Diwali and Easter.

Curriculum

Literacy

Reading and Writing: Our children will be introduced to our reading programme — Read, Write inc. this term. They will be introduced to the first letter sounds and will begin putting these together to read and spell simple words. We will also be enjoying a range of other stories as we explore our love of reading. We will begin learning to write the letters that are in our name.

<u>Maths</u>

We start the year looking at matching, sorting and comparing. The children focus on the different ways we can group objects looking at the thing that are the same and things that are difference. We then move onto patterns and begin to look at measuring. In terms of number, we initially focus on I to 3 and by then end of the term, I to 5. We will also look at basic 2D shapes, triangles, circles and 4 sided shapes.

Art

Drawing skills unit, exploring lines and mark-making in different mediums including self-portraits.

PSHE

Autumn I: Me and My Relationships including: special people, my feelings, who can help me.

Autumn 2: Valuing difference

Music

Autumn I: Nursery rhymes and action songs

Autumn 2: Weather and festival songs.

P.E.: Fundamentals

Children will practise and develop their movement skills.

Children will learn these skills by playing a variety of games.

They will develop their sense of personal space, developing their co-ordination and listening skills

Homework

Your support with home learning is vitally important this year in order to extend and consolidate the work that we do. This will help to ensure that your children achieve as well as they possibly can.

Children will bring home letter formation sheets to support what we have covered in class and consolidate learning. You do not need to return these sheets (you may choose to keep them at home for further practise) but you could upload a picture on Tapestry.

Children will shortly receive either a sharing book or reading book depending on their phonic knowledge. Please bring them to school every day. We may also send practise videos home to watch.

Uniform and PE Kit

We are incredibly proud of how smart our Reception children look following the school's uniform policy. Your child must bring a weather suitable coat every day.

PE KIT

PE kit MUST be clearly labelled with your child's name.

A standard PE kit should contain;
