News Update 11th July 2025

Dear parents and carers,

We are hurtling towards the end of the summer term, and there is so much to celebrate in today's news update.

A special celebration - SATS Results: As we are beginning our final goodbyes to our Year 6s, I wanted to share that they have all achieved some wonderful SATS results this year. Their combined results will place us in the **top 5% of schools nationally**. 91% passed their reading, 91% passed their writing, and 91% passed their Mathematics. 89% passed all three. This is now our second year of superb results, and we could not be more proud of their achievements and their progress this year. Everyone in the cohort has moved mountains to make such great progress.

More to celebrate: Our Year 4s have also smashed it out of the park in their recent statutory multiplication check. Over 57% of them scored full marks compared to only 38% nationally. This again will mean that our national ranking is very high.

And even more: Our Year 1s have also achieved very well in their phonics results this year. Over 90% of them passed the Phonics check compared to 80% nationally.

The children in our school all work so hard to be the best that they can be. Thank you also to our great and dedicated staff team.

Children's Exercise Books: We will be sending home children's completed exercise books next week. Please could you send your child to school with an extra bag next week for these books - some pupils have completed 6 Maths books alone this year! Please also remember that teachers do not routinely make comments in books. Our teachers work hard to provide on-the-spot feedback in lessons, and therefore, work may look unmarked. This is because feedback would have been given in the lesson or at the start of the following lesson.

Reading books: Can all reading and library books that children have at home please be returned to school by Wednesday next week and handed into staff.

School Meal Price Increase from September 2025: Starting from Wednesday, 3 September 2025, the cost of school dinners will increase to £3.00 per day, which is £15.00 per week. This decision has not been made lightly. The increase is necessary to ensure we can continue to provide highquality, nutritious meals for all pupils. We remain fully committed to offering balanced, healthy meals that meet national nutritional standards.

The rising costs in ingredients, staffing, and kitchen operations mean we must adjust our pricing to maintain the high standard of our freshly prepared meals. We now source from local suppliers, including Haighs for fresh rolls and ham, to support quality and sustainability.

Even with this change, our school dinners remain among the lowest in the area.

We understand that affordability is important for families. Free school meals will remain available to those who are eligible. If you think you may qualify or need any support, please contact the school office in confidence.
