This guide unpacks the dangers of Al-generated videos, from the emotional impact of fake distressing content to the potential for impersonation and bullying. With practical tips to help spot deepfakes and navigate online spaces with confidence, this guide is an essential read for parents navigating this rapidly evolving digital landscape.
