Dear parents and carers,

I hope you have had a lovely week. Unfortunately, it looks like the sunny weather is due to change over the weekend. Whatever you have planned, I hope that you all have many adventures.

The Adventure begins here....... Our theme for the next month in school is adventuring. As shared previously we have many adventures in school lined up. This week we have sent home our ADVENTURE CHALLENGE cards. We are encouraging our children to undertake 15-20 minutes of adventuring and fitness a day. We are challenging children to complete as many days as possible, undertaking as many different activities as they can. These can be at home or in school. Fitness isn't just about physical activity – it's about developing a healthy lifestyle. Activities might include eating 5-a-day or even undertaking some meditation! Everyone is being encouraged to take part – Children, parents, family members and school staff.
