School Governor visit dated January 2026: Loren Redmond, Chair of Governors, recently visited Jericho's Early Years provision, including Nursery and Reception, to observe and review the learning environment and curriculum.

During the visit, Loren met with Mrs Smith to review key documents and the Early Years improvement plans developed collaboratively by staff and governors. The curriculum was praised for being well-structured, fun, and interactive, blending national standards with Jericho's own high expectations.

In Nursery, children engaged in imaginative play and activities linked to the story "Goldilocks and the Three Bears," learning about size and maths through playful chalk drawings and games. The Reception classes focused on creative art, exploring fireworks through painting and learning about London landmarks, integrating art, colour theory, geography, and history in an engaging way.

Loren noted the excellent behaviour of the children and the effective classroom routines that balance fun with structure. The staff use creative methods to maintain attention and teach important social skills.

Loren will return in six months to continue supporting and sharing updates with parents, reinforcing the strong partnership between governors, staff, and families.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

For the next few weeks Mrs Hayes will be sharing with parents and carers the various in-house therapies and programs that staff at Jericho are trained to deliver.

As Mental Health and Wellbeing Lead, Mrs Hayes, alongside Mrs Leck in her role as Designated Safeguarding Lead and Mrs Ball in her role as SENDCo, meet weekly and together children that have had concerns raised about them whether it be by a parent or teacher after discussion with a parent are triaged. The support that we feel the child needs for whatever the presenting issue is can then be put in place as speedily as possible.

This week we are looking at Drawing and Talking Therapy.

"Drawing and Talking is a therapeutic intervention for children, young people and adults. It is designed as a short-term, time limited, pro-active intervention intended to complement, rather than replace, the work of specialist mental health services.

Through a 12-week cycle of 30-minute one-to-one sessions, this non-intrusive tool allows children, young people and adults to process emotional pain resulting from trauma. The child or adult utilises drawing as a way to help them express their feelings differently from ordinary verbal language.

Drawing and Talking takes place in the same place at the same time every week and what is discussed between the child or young person and the adult stays between them unless a disclosure is made that needs to be passed onto the DSL.
