Geography			Deadly 60 Children expand their knowledge of scale understanding where Whitehaven, Carise, UK fit in the word. They explore the continents and oceans in the context of dangerous animals.	Frozen Planet Children will develop their geographical knowledge of the Polar region of Antarotica focusing on Shackleton's 1914–17 Endurance Expedition.	Australian Adventures Children will develop their geographical knowledge of Australia on a world map and globe, and explore Australia's location in relation to its surrounding countries, continents and oceans.
History	Space Invaders Children explore the Moon Landings and Neil Armstrong. They identify a historical global event and explain why this is significant and the impact on fives, past and present (significance).	Great Fire of London Children explore, recognise and appreciate the history of this significant event that impacted the UK nationally. They examine remains of the past and consider why they should be preserved.

Class work & homework...

- Curriculum Our curriculum maps are on the school website. These set out in more detail the content of the curriculum over the year. All our curriculum subjects have been planned so term by term, year by year, children build their knowledge sequentially. We will also send a termly newsletter to you with curriculum updates.
- Reading Children can change their RWInc books on Wednesdays. We collect reading records in on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and ask you to read with your child and sign their reading record at least 4 times a week. Children read aloud to their class teacher daily in RWInc and will also read 1:1 with an adult regularly.
- Reading Records Please ensure these reads are recorded in their Reading Records which are collected daily. See reading section and class page on the website for suggested reads and don't forget our online library. Children can download books for free with their username and password. Which we will get to you as soon as we can.
- ▶ Homework following on from their previous homework routines, the children will have spelling, reading, arithmetic and TTRS homework consistently. The homework will be set weekly and is due to be completed by **Tuesday** each week. Homework is sent via Seesaw. The Seesaw QR code is stuck into your child's homework book. Homework should be completed in their English and Maths Homework books and then a photo of this completed work should be uploaded onto Seesaw. Homework will be checked weekly. Spellings will be tested weekly on Tuesday each week.
- ▶ Intervention as in previous years, your child may attend some smaller group sessions in particular subject areas in order to help their confidence with certain tasks or give them the opportunity to ask questions and address misconceptions in a smaller group or 1 to 1 environment. These will be fluid and change according to all pupils' needs as the year progresses.




Below is a table demonstrating the cumulative impact regular reading can have on your child's learning.

By reading aloud, Jack's dad has given him knowledge of new places - real and imagined.






Assessment and keeping in touch.....

- Assessment in school is continuous within normal learning and class practice. We undertake most as sessment now with on the spot marking and feedback. This means that in lessons we mark work as move round the classroom. This helps us to address misconceptions and move children on quicker than traditionally marking a set of books.
- ▶ We undertake assessments at the end of units of work. We also check to see if children have remembered key learning from previous weeks, terms and years as part of our work. We do undertake some formal testing at the end of each term. This is in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.
- You are welcome to make contact at any point however we will catch up with you three times over the year.
 - ▶ October wk commencing 7th October— 1:1 in person meetings, settling in and advice on helping at home.
 - ▶ January wk commencing 13th Jan– 1:1 over the phone / in person meeting reviewing Autumn Assessments and setting targets for the Spring Term.
 - ▶ April wk commencing 28th April over the phone / in person meeting reviewing Spring Assessments and setting targets for the Summer Term.
 - ▶ July Final written report for the year.
 - ▶ If you child has an IEP for a special educational need / disability, we will meet with you separately for a longer appointment. We will share your child's individual plan and set them more detailed goals to work towards.




We will endeavour to keep it as up to date as possible.
