

Year 3

Welcome to Year 3!

We hope you have had an enjoyable summer and are keen and ready to start this academic year. It is going to be an exciting year as we have some fantastic new topics to enjoy! Well done to everyone so far, as our children have settled in beautifully and our classrooms have been busy and cheerful. We are particularly enjoying getting to know the many characters in Year 3 and enthusing your children with our new year group learning.

This term our curriculum covers the following areas:

Literacy: In our reading and writing this term we will be looking at setting descriptions, non-chronological reports and persuasive letters. We will also be reading: How to wash a woolly mammoth, The King who banned the dark, Stone Age Boy, Smoot, The Dark, Stonehenge, Ug and The Sound Collector.

We will be identifying word classes — verbs, adjectives, nouns and adverbs and will be practising using the suffix ly to make adverbs. We will also be using commas to separate items in a list.

Mathematics: Our term starts by understanding place value up to 1000. We will be looking at how to represent numbers up to 1000 and partition numbers to explore how numbers up to 1000 are made. We will then learn about how we order numbers and will use this to help count on back in 50's. We will then move on to addition and subtraction of 10's 100's crossing the 10's boundaries. We will use column addition and subtraction to add and subtract two numbers together.

Science: Our topic is light and how we see light. We will learn about how light travels in straight lines and how it acts when it meets objects. We will learn the key words, transparent, opaque, translucent. We finish by investigate how shadows are formed and change size.

History: In History we will be learning about Pre-historic Britain. This includes the evolution of humans, Humans arrival in Britain and the 3 different periods of the stone age and the arrival of the bronze and iron age. We will look at the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic era before finally thinking about what happened with the discovery of metal

R.E.: We are exploring Jesus's miracles as part of our Christianity learning.

Art: Drawing skills with a focus on line and form, shading with different pencils and painting cave art.

PSHE: Relationships with a focus on friendships and what makes a person special.

Music: We will be exploring music notation and how we write down music.

French: Introduction to the language with greeting words, how to describe how you feel and numbers to ten.

P.E. Games skills and gymnastics, working on attack and defence skills and creating a sequence of movements using turns and controlling our body.

Please ask your children all about their learning, we are learning lots this term!



Uniform and PE Kit

We are incredibly proud of how smart our Year 3's look following the school's uniform policy. The expectations for PE kit can also be found here and this was parentmailed out very recently. For health and safety reasons, we request that long hair is to be tied back in PE lessons and earrings should be removed. If they cannot be removed, then they should be covered with tape.

A standard PE kit should contain;

- White t-shirt
- Dark shorts/jogging bottoms/leggings
- trainers
- All hair should be tied back and earrings will be covered if not removed.

Friday — gymnastics ,. children can wear their PE kits to school and change into their uniforms after the lesson.
