This term our curriculum covers the following areas:

Literacy: In our reading and writing this term we will be Looking at third person narratives, instructions, non-chronological reports and formal letters of complaint. We will also be reading: Stone Girl Bone Girl, The Magic Faraway Tree and Fantastic Mr Fox. Some classic texts and authors loved by many. We will be identifying main and subordinating clauses, prepositions, adverbs and using a/an accurately. In addition, we will be practising using suffixes and prefixes. We will also be using commas to separate adjectives in expanded noun phrases and in a list. Mathematics: Our term starts by continuing to focus on our times tables, specifically the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. We will then move on to learning how to set out 2-digit x I digit multiplication in columns and the tens and ones method for division. Following this, we learn to measure and convert mm, cm and m and find the perimeter. In our fraction work, we'll be ordering fractions, finding equivalent fractions and fractions of amounts.





Science: Our topic is rocks and how they are formed. We will learn how the different rock types, fossils and soil are formed as well as investigate the layers of the earth and evidence of weathering and erosion. There will also be a fantastic trip to Keswick for a Rocks and Fossil workshop to help deepen our rock knowledge. In Spring 2, our focus is plants. We will identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants and look at what plants need for life and to growth. Also, we'll investigate the way in which water are transported within plants and explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants. Geography: In Geography we will be learning about tectonic plates, the formation of mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes and the impact of these on the world around them. A fascinating topic that links brilliantly to our work in Science. In Spring 2, we learn about the water cycle and where water comes from? We study what makes up the weather, why we have seasons and consider why is the world's weather changing? R.E.: Our first Spring enquiry is the celebration of Diwali, focusing on belonging, the story of Rama and Sita and how Hindus celebrate together. In our Easter enquiry, we explore the Easter story with a lens of forgiveness for Christians. Art: Creating mixed media landscapes using watercolour and sewing textiles in the style of Alice Kettle and Sandra Goldsborough. DT: Developing our artwork through sewing and embroidery. PSHE: Keeping ourselves safe by assessing risk and knowing how to keep safe online. Music: Exploring the work of Bob Marley and the genre of Reggae music French: Learning animal and instrument names P.E. Basketball, developing passing and moving skills and

applying these to basketball games.

Uniform and PE Kit
