Year 5

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Year 5! We can't believe we have already spent 2 weeks with your children! Well done to everyone so far, as the children have settled into our classes beautifully and our classrooms have been busy and cheerful. We're particularly enjoying our Science work on the Earth and Space and our class reader, 'Kick'. The children are also doing a fantastic job with their independent organisation and willingness to go the extra mile! What a fantastic start.

We want your child to have a happy and successful time in their final years of primary school with us at Jericho. This letter will share important information with you regarding some of the routines and expectations in Year 5.

The Year 5 Team

Autumn Term Learning

Literacy: Next we will be writing biographies on Neil Armstrong. In guided reading, we are studying a number of biographies of famous people and other texts linked to our wider curriculum. In class, we are reading "Kick" by Mitch Johnson.

In our Writing we will be looking at biographies, focusing on tense changes, developing relative clauses and how pronouns and conjunctions can ensure our writing flows. We have already written free verse poems and studied letters of application too!

In Mathematics we started the term by looking at using Roman numerals up to 1000 before quickly moving on to learning about numbers up to 1,000,000. We look at Powers of 10 and thinking about adding 10, 100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000 to numbers. We move on to rounding within 100,000 and 1,000,000 before moving on to addition and subtraction. We add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits and then use the inverse to check our calculations. We finally finish the half term by looking at multi-step problems.

In Science we are learning about 'Earth and Space'. We have looked at the Big Bang Theory and found out about the location of the Solar System and the Universe.

We have learned about the Sun and the heliocentric and geocentric theories plus we have learned about how the Earth's movement links to the changing seasons. We will find out about the movement of the moon and its phases before finally thinking about comets, asteroids and meteors.

In Geography we will think about what is meant by the term – sustainability and how we produce energy? We will learn about what is special about Curitiba (Brazil) and Freiburg (Germany). We will finally think about energy security and what this may mean for the future.

R.E: Exploring if everyone can be happy all the time. We will be looking at this through studying Buddhism and its origins, including the story of Prince Siddhartha.

Art: Flora and Fauna - Drawing and sketching skills linked to what we might find in local hedgerows. In this unit, pupils will develop an understanding of tone and use of mixed media such as oil pastels, pen, graphite sticks, and sketch pencils.

PSHE: Me and My Relationships and Rights and Responsibilities. We look at how to deal with different situations through negotiation and compromise, how to collaborate as part of a team, will build on earlier learning about assertiveness, before studying risk factors in different situations.

Music: We will be practising our singing, playing and composition skills through 'Livin' on a prayer' by Bon Jovi. As part of this we will study and appraise many well know classic rock songs!

French: We will be studying French phonics and learning phrases linked to classroom commands, focusing on what is in our pencil case and school bag. This provides an opportunity to use words which support helpful sentence structures such as: 'un / une', 'j'ai', and 'dans ma'.

P.E: We are practising Hockey as an invasion game where we learn about positioning and communication with team mates while practising the skills of how to use a hockey stick, the way contact should be made with the ball, how to pass, change direction, and change pace.

Computing: We will be revisiting e-Safety where we look at the importance of being an upstander against cyberbullying and other online behaviours as part of being a good digital citizen, as well as looking at copyright and how to be discerning in assessing the reliability of online sources.

Your support with home learning is vitally important this year in order to extend and consolidate the work that we do in Year 5. This will help to ensure that your children achieve as well as they possibly can. Homework in Year 5 will be sent home each Tuesday, for return on the following Monday evening or Tuesday morning (you will notice the due dates are now set on Seesaw to the Tuesday a week after the work is set).





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A basic outline of homework is given below for your child's year group:

Literacy

- Daily reading (a minimum of fifteen minutes).
- 10 spellings. Usually, five of these will be taken from the Year 5/6 statutory spelling word list. The other five words will be based on key spelling rules or subject-specific vocabulary being used in lessons. If there are words children have struggled with that week, we may also include some of these too.
- A Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG) activity with answers attached.

Maths

- 20 arithmetic questions. These should be done over the course of the week that your child has their homework (focusing on a few each day) with the intention of developing rapid recall skills ahead of the timed arithmetic SAT. Answers will be attached. Times Table Rockstars - 10 minutes daily is recommended. A timer could be used to avoid over lengthy amounts of screen time spent on these apps.

In most cases, the SPaG and arithmetic questions will be based on previously taught concepts from lower year groups, however we understand that post-Covid there may be odd gaps in our children's knowledge. In these instances, we'd ask that children attempt the learning they are finding tricky as best they can, and then teachers will feedback on focus questions and continue to address gaps/misconceptions in class once homework has been uploaded.

Children understand that the same high expectations of presentation we have in the classroom must be applied to all written homework tasks. Unless otherwise stated, we kindly ask that, going forward, work is completed in their homework books (new ones have now been given to any children needing them, but please ask if you are short at any point in the year and we can send new ones) using a sharp pencil and a ruler where necessary.

Uniform and PE Kit

We are incredibly proud of how smart our Year 5s look following the school's uniform policy. The expectations for PE kit can also be found there (PE kit summary below). For health and safety reasons, we request that long hair be tied back in PE lessons and earrings be removed. If they cannot be removed, then they should be covered with tape. Other jewellery should stay at home, as on any school day.

PE KIT

PE kit **MUST** be clearly labelled with your child's name.
A standard PE kit should contain;
-White t-shirt
- Dark shorts/ jogging bottoms
-Trainers
-All hair tied back and earrings covered if not removed

PE Days:

PE days in both Year 5 classes for this half term will be Monday morning. On Monday, please send your child to school wearing their PE kit as this lesson will take place in the morning, and the children will get changed into their uniform after their lunch. As you are already aware, forest / beach schools is on Thursday mornings (5H) and Thursday afternoons (5W). Please refer to the Forest / Beach schools email from Mrs Borrowdale for kit needed in relation to this.

The School Day

The classroom doors open at 8.45am, ready for a prompt and positive start to the school day. Gates are closed at 9.05am. Teachers are available on the yard from 8.45 and at hometime should you need to pass on any quick messages, but also we are always available by telephone through the school office and will happily return any calls after the school day or more urgently if needed.
