Dear Parents/Carers,

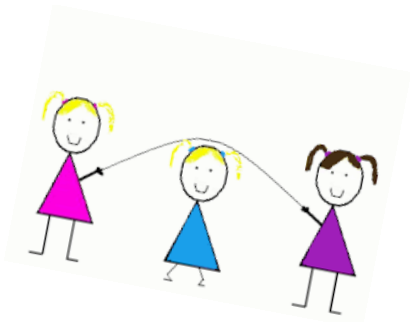

Sixteen intrepid Year 6 pupils did not attend the Kingswood Residential this week, they chose a different adventure -staying in school with Miss Butterworth.

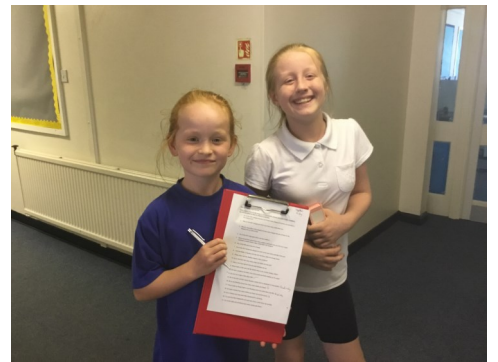

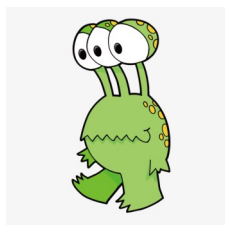
Blasting Jerounds into Space!

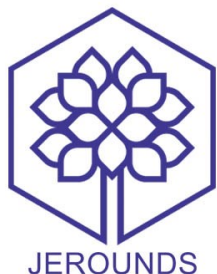
Congratulations Jeannette!
