Dear Parents/Carers,

EYFS News



Our Topic for this half-term is 'Journeys'. We will be focusing on the book 'The Blue Balloon' and our learning will be linked to different journeys and adventures. In Literacy, children have used this story to make and write predictions and they have also used the red words to write their own sentences. We have been encouraging children to construct their own sentences which is something they have been finding difficult.

In Topic, we learnt about different types of transport and where they are used such as land, sea and water. We did a poster to show where the different transport will be found. For example helicopter, aeroplanes can be found in the sky, cars, buses and bicycles will be on land. Whereas ship, submarines will be found in the sea.

In maths, we have been learning about positional language and we learnt about where different items/objects can be placed such as above, under, next to, beside and between. We are recapping addition and subtraction to consolidate learning before Year 1!


