<p>Metacognition</p> <p>Metacognition is a thread that runs through every aspect of school life at Jerounds. Why?</p> <p>Well, in academic terms, it is not WHAT pupils need to learn, but, HOW they learn it best? Metacognition is asking pupils to think about how they learn successfully.</p> <p><i>What should I do first?</i></p> <p><i>Is anything confusing to me?</i></p> <p><i>Can I explain what I have learned?</i></p> <p><i>Should I ask for extra help?</i></p> <p><i>Why did I get this answer wrong?</i></p> <p><i>Can I apply this in different contexts?</i></p> <p><i>How can I do better next time?</i></p> <p>Outcomes for pupils:</p> <p>Plan more effectively (plan); understand their strengths and weaknesses (monitor); reflect on, and improve their learning (evaluate).</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>We will be teaching measurement which consists of time, mass, capacity and length etc and looking at statistics. After this we will be consolidating all mathematical learning including the four calculations and Place Value. Emphasis is being focused even more so on the reasoning behind these concepts. Children need to know their number bonds to 20 and will be working on their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.</p> <p>TTRockstars and Numbots passwords are provided in home school records and should be practiced regularly.</p> <p>This is also a great resource for maths activities Top-marks: teaching resources, interactive resources, worksheets, homework, exam and revision help</p>	<p>English</p> <p>We will start the term by exploring non-fiction texts and creating our own instructions. After this we will be moving onto our new text 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl.</p> <p>Throughout the term, children will develop their reading skills through a range of comprehension, guided and whole class reading texts.</p> <p>Spellings will be given out each Friday on our interactive platform — Spelling Shed and the children will be tested on the following Friday.
