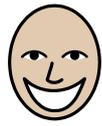
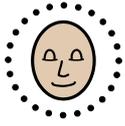

At John Grant School, the most important thing is that



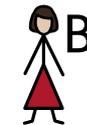
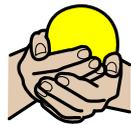

You can talk to any adult in school if you feel unsafe.



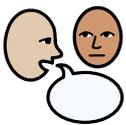
Safeguarding means helping you stay safe, feel safe,

adults.



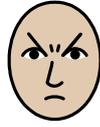
Tell an adult if someone hurts you, bullies you,

you're worried about someone.



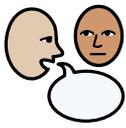
If you feel sad, scared, angry, confused, worried, or



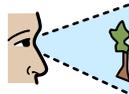
unsafe, adults will listen and help you. You will not

do not hurt others. Tell an adult if someone is

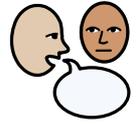
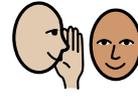
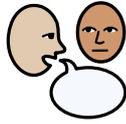

If someone touches you in a way you don't like, scares



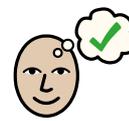
you, or tells you to keep a worrying secret, tell



an adult.



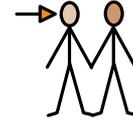
