IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- If your child, or anyone in your household, develops symptoms of Covid-19 (a fever, a new consistent cough or a loss or change in taste or smell), or is identified as a contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, do not send your child to school. Stay at home and arrange for anyone who has symptoms of Covid-19 to get a test by visiting NHS Coronavirus or by calling 119.

- Immediately let the school know.
- Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly for at least 20 seconds using soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitiser
- Wear a cloth face covering on public transport, in shops on the school site and in crowded indoor settings.
- Keep your distance from people who are outside your household or support bubble, limit social gatherings and avoid crowded places.

Reporting Absences

If you are reporting your child as absent due to illness, please call the attendance line by 9:00am. If you can't get through to speak to a member of our office, please leave a message.

If your child is off of school due to sickness that includes a temperature or a cough, please provide more information regarding this (i.e. if they're going to the doctor, if you've called 111 and what advice has been given), as these are COVID symptoms. It is important that the office is given as much information as possible, so we can monitor ill children and help minimise risks for others in the current climate. Thank you.

Water Bottles

Please remember to send your child in with a labelled water bottle for their day at school. As the water fountains are no longer being used to help minimise risks of the virus, all children should have a water bottle in school. Please make sure these are labelled with your child's name and class so they are not getting mixed up and being used by other children.

Lunch Debt – Harrisons

If your child is having school lunches, please make sure you have credit in your child's account. The limit is £18. If your child is in Year 6, your child's Harrisons lunch account must have money in it at all times. You can call Harrisons on 02082800311 or create an account online. 
a) Not giving children nuts or any nut products in school lunches

Please note that the minimum age required to collect a child from school is 16 years old. Please also ensure that you inform the office if somebody different is collecting your child. Teachers will not allow children to go home with somebody that they do not know. Only children in Year 5 and Year 6 will be allowed to walk home alone and this is only when they have written permission.

Attendance



At John Perryn, we have an attendance target of 96.1%. It is of utmost importance that children and parents are striving to maintain attendance as close to this target as possible.



If your attendance is 90% that means you've still missed 19 days of school!!

It is essential that all children return to school unless you have been advised by a medical practitioner to keep them at home. The children have missed out on some aspects of their education, their friendships and their routine. It is important that these are reestablished. The school will follow the attendance policy if children do not return.

If you have any concerns regarding sending your child to school due to coronavirus, please call the office and we will be happy to talk through any concerns / queries.

Uniform

Children are expected to wear full school uniform upon returning to school. Details for the school uniform and where to purchase it can be found on our <u>school</u> website uniform page.

Please note, we no longer sell uniform at the school; it has to be purchased directly from our supplier, School Bells.

The only exception to this is on PE days for your child's year group, where they must wear their PE kit to school. This is to avoid having to change for PE and having to store kits in school. Plain black trainers (with no additional colours or patterns) are allowed to be worn, including for PE.

Your child is not allowed to wear hoop or dangly earrings. Only small studs are permitted for health and safety reasons.

Mr Perring (Year 2 Willow)




