 Each weekday on CBBC TV channel, there is a 3 hour block of primary school programming from 9am focusing on maths, English and foundation subjects such as art and history. 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SeeSaw



This online interactive platform allows for children and their teachers to communicate remotely. It's a lot more personal than just completing worksheets online! Children can complete activities, enhanced by recording their voices or even themselves completing the activities or explaining their work.

By now you should have received your child's log in code (no email or password needed for this – just a simple code).

If you have not received your log-in details, please email our school admin address so we can re-send it to you.

As SeeSaw is the same website used during the first lockdown, most of our families should already be familiar with the way it works. However, if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

The school expectation for your child is that they are logging into Seesaw daily and completing at least one maths, one English and one other foundation subject task set by their teacher.

On Friday's, there will also be PE, Music and Spanish (for KS2) activities set for the following week that children can partake it.
