Thank you to all of the parent that attended the virtual Relationships Education workshops with Mrs. Murray last week. All of the presentations are now available on our website -



Nut Allergies - We are a 'nut free school'

There are a number pupils in our school who have allergies to nuts. In some cases such an allergy can cause a severe allergic reaction. As such, we are asking for your help, as a precautionary measure, in minimizing the risk to all by:

- a) Not giving children nuts or any nut products in school lunches
- b) Not giving peanut butter sandwiches, other spreads containing nuts such as Nutella or snacks/bars containing nuts or labelled "may contain nut traces" in school lunches.
- c) Asking children not to share their lunches.

Water Bottles

Please remember to send your child in with a **labelled** (your child's full name and class) water bottle for their day at school. As the water fountains are no longer being used to help minimise risks of the virus, all children should have a water bottle in school.

Lunch Debt - Harrisons

If your child is having school lunches, please make sure you have credit in your child's account. The debt limit is £15. If your child is in Year 6, your child's Harrisons lunch account must be in credit at all times. You can call Harrisons on 02082800311 or create an account online at www.ealingmeals.com.

Please note that the minimum age required to collect a child from school is **16 years old**. Please also ensure that you inform the office if somebody different is collecting your child. Teachers will not allow children to go home with somebody that they do not know. **Only children in Year 5 and Year 6 will be allowed to walk home alone and this is only when they have written permission.**

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KS1 News



Year I News

Last half term year I have been focusing on recapping all the phonic sounds we've learnt and learning a new sound each day. We also began reading a wide range of new books in English, chosen our favourite books and been focusing on our handwriting; started to learn how to join up our writing.

In maths the children have been learning about 3D shapes and patterns. We have also learnt how to tell the time as well as finding 1/2 or 1/4 of a number.

In art we have been looking at 'magical art' and using different types of mediums to design and create our own scratch art. The children en joyed using chalk, paint, felt tips and pencils to create their designs.

Our topic in science was about animals and their classifications, we spoke about the groups of animals, their diet and they appearances.

This half term we have also been learning about celebrations in R.E. The children learned about the environment and what we could do to make the environment better. We also learned about the Easter story and why many people celebrate Easter.



In summer term, we will continue learning our phonic sounds and writing sentences using our phonics skills with support from a wide range of books. In maths we will be counting backwards from IOO using different resources to support us. In geography we are learning how to use maps and atlas', create our own maps with keys. In art we will be looking at different primary colours, secondary colours, shading and tinting. Our science is going to be about plants, we will be planting our own seeds and we will learn about the parts of a plant. For R.E. we will be looking at stories in religion and different religious books. We will discuss what the stories are teaching us and why they are important.


Year 2 News

We were extremely happy to welcome our children back to class again in Spring 2. At the end of the term we started to compose our own stories based around a castle. Children used imaginative ad jectives, con junction, a variety of openers and their own ideas to decide on a problem for their hero as

well as a solution. We then went on to write our very own poems using rhyming words about our pet dragons. The children were very excited to show


their work to all of the parents on our wow wall displays outside of our classrooms.




Maths

We have been looking at how to use arrays, circles and dots as well as repeated addition to solve problems. Children can now confidently count in 2's, 5's and 10's and are starting to recite their 3's as well! In maths children have started to take part in innovotive number talks where they use all of their previous knowledge to look at a sumer of items or make a comment on a picture they can see using their maths knowledge. They independently write equations of any and every type to then participate in a sharing and challenging process

around the room. Through doing this regularly in class the children are now extremely confident with their stratergies and knowledge of number.





Summer Term

This half term we are very excited to introduce to the children to our caterpillar and tadpole visitors as we embark on learning about life cycles. We are also looking at spacial senses, maps and globes in geography as we move on to our last full term in year 2. In both maths and English we will be concentrating on the children being able to dive deeply and apply all of their knowledge to every task we present them with. We are really happy to see you all back at school and hope that this term we can en joy many different sunny occasions with you all.
