
Have a wonderful half term break. Stay safe and I look forward to seeing you all on Monday 7th June. Best wishes,



Reminders

Nut Allergies - We are a 'nut free school'

There are a number pupils in our school who have allergies to nuts. In some cases such an allergy can cause a severe allergic reaction. As such, we are asking for your help, as a precautionary measure, in minimizing the risk to all by:

a) Not giving children nuts or any nut products in school lunches

b) Not giving peanut butter sandwiches, other spreads containing nuts such as Nutella or snacks/bars containing nuts or labelled "may contain nut traces" in school lunches.

c) Asking children not to share their lunches.

Water Bottles & Uniform

Please remember to send your child in with a **labelled** (your child's full name and class) water bottle for their day at school. All children are expected to wear full school uniform aside from on the day they have PE lessons. Uniform needs to be clearly labelled. You can view our uniform policy <u>here.</u>

Lunch Debt – Harrisons

If your child is having school lunches, please make sure you have credit in your child's account. **The debt limit** is £15. If your child is in Year 6, your child's Harrisons lunch account must be in credit at all times. You can call Harrisons on 02082800311 or create an account online at <u>www.ealingmeals.com</u>.

Please note that the minimum age required to collect a child from school is **16 years old**. Please also ensure that you inform the office if somebody different is collecting your child. Teachers will not allow children to go home with somebody that they do not know. **Only children in Year 5 and Year 6 will be allowed to walk home alone and this is only when they have written permission.**

If you are changing your details (e.g. address, mobile number or email address) please inform the office ASAP so we can update them on our system. PLEASE make sure all epi-pens and asthma pumps that are kept in school for your child are in date. It is your responsibility to drop in replacements when they expire.

If you or your child has a hospital / doctor / dentist or any other appointment, which means you have to drop them to school late or collect them early, please remember to inform the office the day before.


Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters: An African Tale by John Steptoe



Year 3 News

We would like to start by taking this opportunity to thank all the children in Year 3 for making such a fantastic effort during this half term. They have been working so hard already and we have every faith that this hard work will continue when they go to year 4 very soon. Let's have a look what year 3 have been up to...

Year 3 have been reading the book Gregory Cool by Caroline Binch. The book tells the story of Gregory. Gregory travels to Tobago to visit his grandparents and initially finds it hard to ad just to a contrasting way of life. However, the warmth of the people and the climate, depicted in the light and shade of Caroline Binch's vivacious illustrations soon make him realize what he is missing by not opening up his heart and mind. We focused on writing setting descriptions and an amazing double page spread!

In maths on Number Day, the children took part in a number of maths activities. They were encouraged to make a donation and wear green or an item of clothing with a number on it. The funds raised from Number Day helped to support vital NSPCC services such as 'Speak Out. Stay Safe', which visits primary schools across the UK to teach students all about the dangers of abuse and what they can do to help. The pupils loved it, and it helped to build motivational attitudes towards mathematics.

In science, we have been learning about light and the children have extended their knowledge on this topic. They learnt that there are many different sources of light and the light of the sun is vital for life on earth. The children worked scientifically to find out if materials are transparent or opaque using torches and their own shadow! There were frequent opportunities for observing and investigating how light behaves and how materials interact with light during our science lessons.


Please remember to complete your Seesaw homework. There is a spelling test every Friday and remember to spend at least 20 minutes reading each day and bring the reading record on Fridays too.


in PE clothes on Fridays for next half term.

Lower KS2 News

Year 4 News

It was an encouraging start when Year 4 returned after the long lockdown in Spring. Both teachers and pupils were happy to see each other, and we have not stopped working since then! Let's see what they have been up to...

In English, the children kicked off with the revisiting grammar and punctuation work which they applied in their writings. We selected the story of Judy Moody: 'Around the World in 8 ½ Days' by Megan McDonald which matched well with the theme of 'The Globe' for Geography. Children used their taught skills and imagination to write a coherent plot with a funny twist at the end. They edited their writings with expanded noun phrases, similes and short sentences to build tension. It is amazing to see how much they had progressed with their learning in such a short span of time.

In Guided Reading, the children have been exposed to a wide range of carefully selected texts. The children are not only answering inferential and deductive questions, but are now beginning to annotate the texts after analysing them on genre, style, theme and format. They are beginning to critically evaluate the texts as a whole and give overall comments. This is a positive step in the right direction of becoming mature readers.

In Maths, they had been revisiting number facts and diving deep into exploring different representations to support their understanding. They used key vocabulary to explain their thoughts. In Number Talks, children were challenged to explain, show, and prove the task that was given to them. We combined the Number day with Maths learning and played multiplication games to race against each other. Our school managed to raise £200 for NSPCC to support the mental well-being of children. We feel proud to contribute to a worthy cause.


In Science, we had been investigating microhabitats in our school gardens. Children learnt what ecosystem is and were able to make all the necessary links to show how ecosystem survives in our world. They reflected on the importance in maintaining and protecting the ecosystem. The children also experimented to find out which water was more polluted. They were amazed at the discovery of the level of pollutants a puddle by the busy road can have compared to pond water in the park.

Miss Navarro continued to teach Spanish where the focus was to have a confident conversation with partners. This was an enjoyable experience where the children were able to have a conversation with their partners.

It has been a term with lots of hard work and great learning with progress! There will be some fun activities in Seesaw to do over the half term break. We continue to seek valuable parents' support in their learning as the children prepare for the final half term before they go to Year 5. Thank you to all parents and carers for your invaluable help. We are very proud of our children and their resilience in their learning! Wishing all of you a relaxing and sunny break!
