Topic: Growing and Changing



Literacy We will be reading the following stories: 'Jasper's Beanstalk' by Nick Butterworth and 'The Enormous Turnip' by Katie Daynes. The children will link their own experiences to books, talk about the characters, make a zig-zag book about how they grow whilst contributing to the class interactive book. They will also join in with stories and poems during one-to-one sessions and in small groups and give meaning to marks as they draw and play.	 <u>Mathematics</u> The children will be focusing on: Ordering – height, weight, width and length. They will be using some number names and number language spontaneously especially in play. Number formation (gross motor) using paint, using fingers in the sand and using marbles to move around number templates. 	 Understanding the World The children will: Recognise there are different seasons and will be able to describe things we do in the different seasons. Explore the natural world looking closely at living things. Understand that animals are living things that grow and change over time.
 Physical Development The children will be: Making collages/models using scissors, glue, tape, paper and junk. Continuing to develop their pencil grip. Beginning to draw recognisable figures. Write their name at every opportunity using name cards. 	 Personal, Social and Emotional Development The children will be: Contributing to class discussions about looking after plants both in the local environment and in the classroom. Discuss how to treat mini beasts. Increasing their independence in meeting their own care needs. 	 Communication and Language The children will: Use the internet to explore about plants/ self. Have structured and unstructured discussions linked to books, topics, routines and events etc. Start a conversation with an adult or friend and continue it for many turns.
 Expressive Arts and Design The children will be: Painting symmetrical flowers. Moving to music and acting out stories & songs. Making models from clay. 	 Personal Social Health Education (PSHE) The children will be learning: To explain how to keep themselves clean and healthy and explain why it is important. To identify the people in my family and explain where I can get help. To identify how to manage feelings. 	 Ideas for home to support Read stories in both English and their home language. Talk to your child at home about feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', and 'angry' or 'worried'. Support your child to be independent as they get dressed and undressed.
