Targeted academic support for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	1:1 or small group interventions for phonics.
Priority 2	Speech and language programme introduced in Reception.
Priority 3	Experienced teachers to take smaller groups in Year 6.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Gaps in phonics knowledge, smaller groups allow better focus on individual children and improve deficits in early speech, language and communication.
Projected spending	£45000

Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Counselling service.
Priority 2	Chromebooks for children who cannot access online learning.
Priority 3	Clear systems and strategies to improve attendance.
Priority 4	Employ Speech and Language Therapist to identify communication gaps.
Priority 5	Non class based SENCo and DSL to support families
Priority 6	DHT to lead on Family Schools Partnership Award to engage more families.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Children's mental health and ability to be ready to access classroom learning, ensuring that children do not fall behind due to further lockdowns/isolation.
Projected spending	£110,000
