



<p>English In English, children will be reading the story of, ‘A Midsummer Night’s Dream’ by William Shakespeare. They will be writing a play script as well as an alternative ending and poetry. They will continue to focus on learning the different features of grammar, spelling and punctuation appropriate for these pieces of writing.</p>	<p>Maths This term we will continue our learning on multiplication and division. The focus will also be reasoning skills and number fluency through Number Talks and a variety of starters for each lesson. The children will be able to solve a range of multi-step word problems and they will understand the steps involved in solving a problem. Once secure, they will be moving to applying their knowledge of the four operations in Shapes and Measures.</p>	<p>Science In Science, the children will be learning about the Classification of Plants and Animals. They will be introduced to the Classification definition and then continue to discuss and explore what animals can be classified under the different groups of vertebrates and invertebrates. They will also cover plants classification and understand the main differences within the different categories.</p>
<p>History In History, the children will study Greek life and achievements and their influence on the Western world. Children will look at City States and draw comparisons between Athens and Sparta. Children will create a short cartoon script to tell the story of a memorable part of the Persian Wars. They will explain why Alexander the Great is an important person in Greek history.</p>	<p>Physical Education (PE) In PE, children will be training for the Sports Day events. They will be focussing on sprints and long distance running. They will also prepare for relay events like passing the baton and field events like throwing the javelin and discus. Children will be selected for the various events under their respective Houses.</p>	<p>Music This term the theme for music is notation. Children will focus specifically on the treble clef. We will practice recognising notes in the songs and draw them on the staff. We will discuss other clefs in music.</p>
<p>Computing In Computing, the children will explore the concept of repetition in programming using the Scratch environment. Children will look at the difference between count-controlled and infinite loops, and use their knowledge to modify existing animations and games using repetition. Their final project is to design and create a game which uses repetition, applying stages of programming design throughout.</p>	<p>Personal Social Health Education (PSHE) Personal Social Health Education (PSHE) This term, we will be focusing on relationships. The children will be focussing on how to keep themselves safe and respect everyone around them. They will look at basic first aid skills and learn how to keep themselves safe in different situations. They will also learn about who they can speak to if they need help.</p>	<p>Spanish In Spanish, the children will learn vocabulary to describe family members and parts of the face and body. We will continue practising the linguistic focus: gender, articles, plurals and adjectives. By the end of this unit, the children will be able to describe an animal and a person.</p>
<p>Art In Art, children will learn about needlework, embroidery whilst learning about the weaving artist Farrer. They will look at coronation robes and the wedding dress belonging to the Duchess of Cambridge for inspiration. They will practice embroidery and weaving. Children will apply cross-stitch and weaving skills to create a textile art piece.</p>	<p>Religious Education (RE) In RE, children will learn the symbols for different religions as well as looking at artwork that is important in each religion studied. Children will focus on the feelings that this art evokes and the messages it conveys about religion, through this medium. They will produce a piece of religious art work using different techniques.</p>	<p>Geography In Geography, the children will be learning about the continent of Asia with a focus on Japan. Children will learn about its location, weather, climate, and finally its physical features. As well as this, they will look at architecture in Japan. Finally, they will explore the feudal system in Japan and political systems.</p>
