



<p><u>English</u> This term we will be looking at the book, 'Girls for the Vote' where we will be exploring the theme of rights, justice through the eyes of the author Linda Newbery. The children will be writing a formal letter to the British government as a member of the Suffragette Organisation and they will also be researching influential figures and presenting information about the Suffragettes in a non-chronological report.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> The children will be revising fractions and moving on to ratio, proportion, algebra and statistics. They will be solving multi-step problems involving these areas of maths and reviewing their understanding on the taught topics. Children will also practice SATs style questions in arithmetic and reasoning so that they are familiar with the techniques of answering these questions.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> The children's learning will build on the units of 'Animals including Humans' and 'Living Things and their Habitats'. They will learn about fossils, habitats and human development in order to grasp the concepts and ideas. They will learn about variation and adaptation. They will also learn about the scientists Charles Darwin and Alfred Wallace.</p>
<p><u>History</u> This term, we will be looking at the history of Human Rights. Children will be looking at women's rights, children's rights, racial equality and freedom of belief and religion. Children will be examining their thoughts and discussing their rights protected in the ECHR. They will examine the significance of such rights and the impact they have on society.</p>	<p><u>Spanish</u> The children will be reviewing animal vocabulary in Spanish and verbs: soy, estoy, tengo/tienes. They will also review singular, plural, male and female articles and nouns: el, la, los, las/un, una, unos, unas. They will be introduced to a new topic "my family" learning family vocabulary.</p>	<p><u>Physical Education (PE)</u> In PE, the children will be learning skills to play tag rugby. They will be looking at how to evade and tag opponents and pass and receive a pass at speed. They will be looking at how to refine attacking and defending skills and develop tactics as a team to play a game of tag rugby.</p>
<p><u>Personal Social Health Education (PSHE)</u> In the unit, 'Living in the Wider World', the children will look at online safety and take part in Safer Internet Day. They will look at the concept of peer pressure and how to deal with it. They will discuss how they stay safe and identify risky behaviour.</p>	<p><u>Music</u> The children will further understand the differences between semibreves, minims, crotchets, quavers and semiquavers and their equivalent rests. They will develop the skills to read and perform using pitch notation within an octave (e.g. C-C/ Do-Do).</p>	<p><u>Ideas for home support</u> Encourage discussion with your child when pronouncing new words if their reasonable attempt does not sound correct. Practice multiplication and division facts up to 12 times table. Please make sure they know the Year 5 and Year 6 Spelling list words.</p>
