Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to confirm that your child has been offered a space to attend school during this period of national closure and to go through key details for how their time in school will work.

School Hours

We will continue to have staggered start and end times to the day but please note that these have changed slightly in order to reduce contact between year groups. Please ensure that you should arrive at your scheduled time and no earlier. This is really important in order to reduce the risk of transmission at the school gate. We also request that all adults wear masks at pick up and drop off.

Lunches

For the first 3 days of school (Wednesday 6th to Friday 8th January) we will be providing all children who are eligible for free school meals with a cold packed lunch. If your child is not eligible for free school meals, we ask that you send your child to school with their own packed lunch.

From the week beginning Monday 11th January, we will be able to provide children eligible for free school meals with a hot meal. If your child is not eligible for free school meals then you have the option of purchasing a meal via Parent Pay, or continuing to send them with a packed lunch.

Curriculum

Whilst your child is attending school, they will be accessing the same learning as children learning from home. They will be able to participate in P.E. lessons and the daily mile, but should not bring in their P.E. kits to change into, they will be able to participate in their school uniforms. As we will be exercising outside as much as possible, it would be preferable for them to come to school in trainers or comfortable shoes for this. Violin lessons should be going ahead with violin teachers virtually whilst in school, so please can children bring their violins in as normal.

Ventilation

It is now known that keeping indoor spaces well ventilated helps to stop the spread of the virus. With this in mind, staff have been instructed to keep all windows open whilst the children are in school. We ask that you send your child to school with enough layers of clothing to keep them warm, including an outdoor coat.

Wraparound Care

Unfortunately we will not be able to offer any additional before or after school clubs this term. This includes breakfast club. We are very sorry for any inconvenience this causes.

Community testing

Lambeth Council is opening a community testing site for people in the borough that may have Covid-19, but are not experiencing any symptoms. Around one in three people with Covid-19 don't have any symptoms, but they can still pass it on.

The quick, free tests are on offer from Monday, January 4 at Lambeth Town Hall in Brixton town centre. The tests allow people to check if they have Covid-19, with results usually returned within an hour. An appointment must be booked in advance and walk-in requests will not be accepted.

Two more community testing sites in the borough, in Brockwell Park, where the facilities have already been assembled, and at Brixton Windmill in Blenheim Gardens, are to be established in the coming days with further details to be released shortly. Sites in the north and south of the borough are being identified

Please do access these sites and get tested regularly. The more children that are tested, the safer we will be able to keep our entire community. As these tests are a precaution only there is no need to isolate whilst awaiting your results.

What to do if someone in your household develops symptoms

If anyone in your household, or support bubble, develops symptoms, you should arrange a test for them immediately. Please note this will need to be booked via the NHS website or by calling 119. All members of the household should self-isolate at home until you receive the test result. Please inform the school as soon as possible of your child's reason for absence. You must also inform the school of the result of any test (positive or negative), as this may impact on bubbles in school.

We look forward to welcoming your child back into school.
