




# Instructions for how to log your child into Google Classroom




It will be First name followed by first letter of surname [@jubilee.lambeth.sch.uk](mailto:jubilee.lambeth.sch.uk)

I.e. If the name is John Smith then: [johns@jubilee.lambeth.sch.uk](mailto:johns@jubilee.lambeth.sch.uk)




Click on the 9 dots next to where it says G suite.



Click on Classroom.




This will show your child's class or learning group.




Click on it to see the virtual classroom.


The home screen will show messages from the teachers, this could be a general message or announcing what work has been set for the day.
