Trips and Visits

We have all had a very busy half term with many trips and visits taking place. Every class has been out and about and we have been lucky to have some fantastic visitors and workshops for specific groups of children.

Reception went on their first school trip, visiting West Norwood Fire Station as part of their People Who Help Us topic. They got to learn all about fire safety, go inside the fire engine and had great fun squirting the hose.

Year 1: Visited the Museum of Childhood as part of their toy topic. They went on a toy hunt, looked at toys both new and old and even got to play with some toys!

Year 2: Visited Brockwell Greenhouses as part of heir Habitats Science work. They went on a bug hunt, and took part in a bug hotel crafting activity. As part of their RE work on Christianity Year 2 also visited Holy Trinity Church.

Year 3: Visited the Horniman Museum and investigated artefacts and animals from around the world as part of their learning on Adventurers and Explorers.

Year 4: Visited the British Museum to study a range of Mayan artefacts and explore Mayan hieroglyphics as part of their Mayan topic.

Year 5: Visited the Horniman Museum and took part in a workshop on Benin. Children got to look through artefacts from ancient Benin and witnessed the process of how people from ancient Benin created bronze sculptures.

Year 6: Visited London Zoo where they took part in a workshop looking at living things in their habitats, particularly creatures from the rainforest. This tied in with their evolution topic. They also attended a Forensic Science Workshop at St Martins High School where they investigated and solved a mock crime and investigated plant DNA under microscopes.

Class Assemblies

We have had some wonderful and informative Class assemblies this term.
