Vanishing Rainforests



Welcome Back, we are continuing our learning about the precious habitat that is The Tropical Rainforests. This term we will be looking at deforestation, its impact and ways in which we could help. We will also be comparing a Brazil in South America with deciduous rainforests of the UK. We are also very excited to have three amazing school trip this half term, to The Natural History Museum on 6th March, The Vue Cinema in Leicester Square to see the Inseparables on 12th March and Kew Gardens on 21st March. We will need some parent volunteers on these trips if you know that you are available and would like to join us please let your child's class teacher know.

Ideas for home learning:

Collect some pebbles from outside and paint somethings you might find in a rainforest on them.

When you're shopping look out for the Fairtrade logo on items. Research what it means and find out which countries the food comes from on an Atlas.

Visit Brockwell Park or Dulwich Woods and look at the type of woodland areas we have in this country.

Make a bark rubbing in the park.

Goldilocks words:

- Learning about and having a go at debugging our programmes


In Music, Some will be continuing Violin with Music Masters. Year 3 will be continuing to take part in Music lessons provided by Music Masters.
