ENGLISH

- Explore a Greek myth presented in a modern setting; Percy Jackson and the Lightening Thief.
- Generate adventurous vocabulary for writing linked to myths and legends, including: expanded noun phrases, modal verbs and relative clauses.
- Compose their own poetry in the form of an ode.
- Role play alternative ending to different Greek myths.
- Explore and design a character costume linked to the text.
- Compose and edit an additional chapter in the correct narrative style for a myth, linked to Percy Jackson

SCIENCE

- Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the object.
- Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction that act between moving surfaces.
- -Recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.
- -Recording data and results with increasing complexity using scientific diagrams and tables.

COMPUTING

- Equip pupils with the knowledge, understanding and skills to use information and communication technology safely, creatively and purposefully.
- We will be focusing on E—Safety cyber bullying. Using Google Sites the children will research the effects of cyber bullying and then create a website on how to stay safe online and who to speak to if cyber bulling happens to them
