Songs and Rhymes

In Maths we will be:

Learning to count numbers in order.
Learning to represent number through marks.
Beginning to use words "more" or "less".
Using size language.
Noticing shapes in the world around us.
You can help your child's learning by singing counting rhymes, counting how many steps to your house and pointing out the size/shape of things around you.

In Literacy we will be:

Learning how to look after books.
Learning some simple rhymes.
Learning to listen carefully to stories and rhymes so we can say the missing words.
Starting to tell a story from looking at pictures.
Making marks for writing and talk about what they mean.
Learning to recognise our name and some signs around the school.
You can help your child's learning by sharing books with them regularly at home, singing nursery rhymes with your child and visiting the local library.



In Understanding of the World we will be:

Learning about families and our routines.
Learning about what makes us different from each other
Learning/talking about the natural world
Learning how to use different ICT equipment.
You can help your child's learning by sharing stories about family members and by looking at changes in the seasons.

In Expressive arts and design we will be:

Exploring the sounds of different instruments.
Learning simple songs and nursery rhymes.
Moving to music.
Learning the names of colours.
Using role play to share and learn new experiences.
You can help your child's learning by naming the colour of objects, using kitchen utensils to make different sounds and acting out or playing around with stories.

In PSED we will be:

Learning what makes a good friend.
Learning rules to keep us safe.
Learning the importance of sharing and taking turns
Learning when to ask for help and when to try ourselves.
Learning how to care for our nursery equipment.
Making our own choice of activity in nursery.
You can help your child's learning by playing games involving taking turns, talking about how to keep safe and the importance of following rules.

In Physical development we will be:

Developing our spatial awareness by exploring the outside area.
Working on our pencil grip and fine motor skills.
Learning how to put on and do up our coats.
Learning to be aware of danger.
Developing our independence when using the toilet.
You can help your child's learning by showing them how to put on and do their coat up, by taking to them about how we use our bodies to move and by playing with play dough or plasticine.
