Trips and Visits

Year 2 at the Natural History Museum Year 2 learnt all about the human body as part of their Superhumans topic. It was great fun to see how bones and muscles work and to test out our own strength on the different equipment! They loved seeing how our bodies changed in the funny mirrors and comparing themselves to other species. They also looked at all kinds of animals, from gigantic whales and dinosaurs to tiny bugs that live in our homes! Year 2 all agreed that the moving T-Rex was their favourite!

<u>Year 3 Trip to the National Gallery</u> Year 3 visited the National Gallery to support our English topic of 'Myths and Legends'. They looked around the gallery and took part in an exciting workshop where they learnt about different paintings of mythical characters like St George and the Dragon. They particularly enjoyed studying paintings of the Greek gods and characters, like Ariadne, Athena and Medusa, that they have been learning about in school.

<u>Year 4 Violin Workshops</u> Our Year 4 violinists have taken part in workshop and rehearsals led by percussionist Beth Higham-Edwards. The children learnt how to compose for film, developing their creative music making and storytelling skills for a special live performance of their compositions at the BFI London Film festival tomorrow in front of other schools, parents and families.

Year 5 Science Workshops Year 5 were privileged to attend a Forensic Chemistry workshop at St Martins-in-the-Fields Secondary School. In this session children explored the different lab equipment and were able to carry out a forensic investigation using scientific techniques such as filtration, evaporation and chromatography.

<u>Year 6 Natural History Museum</u> Year 6 were also at the Natural History Museum last week participating in a workshop measuring the impact of volcanoes as part of their 'What a wonderful world ' topic. They also looked at the museums impressive array of rocks and minerals - plus taking in the almost obligatory visit to the dinosaurs gallery!

<u>Class Assembly</u> 5TL took us back in time with a memorable performance of Theseus and the Minotaur. They also shared many fascinating facts about life in ancient Greece. Many thanks to all of the parents who came to see their children take part.

<u>Sporting Events</u> Jubilee's Football Team are participating in the Lambeth league at Ferndale Leisure Centre for the first time in many years and they have got off to a flying start, winning both of their matches.
