Year 3 and 4 shared their Samba skills with the rest of the school in their first concert of the year. They are looking forward to putting on another show at the end of the summer term.

The boys also finished the Lambeth League strongly signing off with a 7:nil defeat of St Saviours and a 6:2 victory over Archbishop Sumner.
