<u>Girls Football</u> **Our girls' team had a great time at** their first tournament of the year. They were competing in the Lambeth Schools Games competition and the standard was really high. The A team did fantastically well, winning their first 5 games before just missing out to a very good Henry Cavendish side. The B team did not manage to clock up any wins but played really well, only losing out by a single goal in several of their games and getting a very good draw in their last match.

Boys' Football Our boys' team continue to do well in the Lambeth League. They enjoyed a 4:1 win against Ashmole and followed this with an emphatic 9:1 defeat of Christchurch the following week. Last week they faced top placed Stockwell and 3rd placed Loughborough and acquitted themselves very well; drawing 2:2 with Loughborough and narrowly losing out 3:2 against a Stockwell team who are still unbeaten after 17 games this season.

Year 6 Into University Both Year 6 classes have attended brilliant activity weeks with Into University, a fabulous charity which aims to show children all of the things that university has to offer. During the week, the children found out about universities, visited the chocolate museum, completed work on their Mayan topic and took part in a graduation ceremony, attended by family members, at Kings College London.

Year 5 Year 5 have had an extremely busy few weeks! They have: visited the Southbank Centre to take part in **a storytelling workshop, taken part in a day's activities** at Into University, been visited by Pegasus Opera for workshops in school and had a visit from the Fire Brigade.

<u>Year 3</u> Visited the Black Cultural Archives to take part in a Workshop looking at post war journeys as part of **their 'Do you live here?' topic . We were also visited by a photographer working on Steven McQueen's ambitious** Art project capturing photographs of hundreds of Year 3 classes across London.
