Sport at Jubilee

We have had an incredibly successful end to the academic year in terms of sports. 16 pupils from Years 5 and 6 competed in the Mo Farah Shield, an athletics competition between all of the schools who receive sports coaching from SG Sports, and we were able to win the trophy. Many of the pupils taking part were from Year 5 so we look forward to continuing to have a strong athletics team in 2019/20.

Our Year 5 boys also won the Windmill Cluster Futsal tournament. This was the first time this event had taken place and it followed a 10 week programme of Futsal coaching funded by the Walcott Foundation.

Last week we took part in the Windmill Cluster Football tournament. This is an event we have a strong record of success in (our boys have won for the last two years and the girls reached the finals in both of these years). This year we were incredibly dominant with both the boys and girls teams winning all nine of their matches and winning the boys and girls competitions.

The girls won their second trophy in two days when they won the final of the Brixton Learning Collaborative and Windmill Cluster League the following day.

We are very proud of all our sport people at Jubilee and for the Year 6s in particular it was wonderful to sign off on their time at the school with so many victories!

<u>Summer Fair</u>

The summer fair this year was a huge success. We were treated to excellent performances from our choirs, violinists and performance poets and the Steel Pan band from Pimlico Academy was a real highlight. Great stalls, games and activities and glorious weather also really helped. Huge thanks to all of the Parents Group who worked so hard to make the day a success and to all parents, carers, friends and family who came along and contributed. We raised £2126 for the school. This was an increase on last year's event. Poetry Slam

For the last 3 years all of the schools in the Windmill Cluster (Jubilee, Holy Trinity, Richard Atkins, Sudbourne, St Jude's, Christ Church Streatham, St Luke's and Orchard have competed against each other in Poetry slam. All pupils from Year 3 upwards in each school get to write and perform a poem, winners from each class go on to perform in front of the whole school and the winners from this round are selected to compete against the other schools in a quarter and then semi final before eventually finalists are selected to compete in the final (this year hosted by Trinity Academy). We have a proud tradition in this event, having won it for the last two years running. We were delighted to keep this up, not only by producing the overall winners for the third consecutive year through the sensational Danae and Pa-Riss but also by taking third place as well through Kachief and Ascad.

Music at Jubilee

Both the infant and junior choirs and Year 4 violinists performed at the summer fair. There have been violin concerts for all those participating in LMM this year. These concerts were very well received and attended by a large number of parents. Thank you to all parents who were able to attend. Your support means a great deal to the pupils and staff.
