Curriculum Newsletter Year 4 Autumn 2 The Mayan Civilisation





Welcome to year 4! Our topic this term is The Mayan Civilsation. As part of this topic we will be reading the Ancient Mayan myth, "The Hero Twins". The children, having touched on the subject as part of the previous topic, Chocolate. The topic will commence with the children mixing and tasting a chocolate drink such as the Mayans may have drunk (not the sweet, hot chocolate we may be familiar with today in London)! Also, year 4 will be benefiting from professional cricket coaching, as well as athletics taught by class teachers. This term, 4DD will be sharing our learning at the end of term.

The Goldilocks words are the key vocabulary the children will learn, understand and be able to use by the end of the topic. They are called Goldilocks words as they are not too easy, not too hard, but just right!

In Maths we will be:

- Continue using the column method to add and subtract.
- Explore measurements and different units of measure- focusing on length.
- Use our understanding of length to measure and record perimeters of shapes and objects.
- Begin multiplying numbers by 10 and 100.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and addition.

In Topic we will be learning:

- The importance of the Mayan Civilisation
- about Mayan gods and religious ceremonies.
- about their number system and how it compares to ours.
- about their diet and how it differs from ours?
- How explorers discovered them and the impact it had on their society.
- Where in the world they lived?
- What was Chichen Itza?

In English we will be:

- Reading the Mayan Legend The Hero Twins.
- Making predictions about the story and hot-seating.
- Writing instructions, letters, non-fiction reports and narrative.
- Summarising the information from the text.
- Continuing to write in paragraphs, use fronted adverbials and to use expanded noun phrases.

In Science we will be:

- learning about electricity.
- learning about electrical and nonelectrical appliances.
- explaining how circuits work.
- naming conductors and insulators and creating our own simple circuits including some with a switch.

In PE we will be:

- Developing athletic skills: speed walking, jumping, sprinting, relays and throwing.

In Computing we will be:
