

# Curriculum Newsletter Year 6 Autumn Term Out of Africa

In <u>English</u> we will be exploring the text Varmints by Helen Ward and Marc Craste. We will be:

- Describing settings using expanded noun phrases and adverbial phrases.
- Writing a persuasive leaflet about the plight of the varmints.
- Writing non-chronological reports about endangered species.

Our new **topic** is called *Out of Africa* and we will be learning:

- About what palaeontologists do.
- What we can learn from fossils.
- The history of the theory of evolution.
- About inheritance.

In **Spanish** we will be learning how to:

- Listen and respond to longer text.
- Spell different words
- Conjugate basic verbs.
- Name parts of the face
- Name shapes and their colours.

In <u>science</u> we will be building on our topic work by learning about:

- the role of blood in our body.
- the role of blood to transport oxygen around the body.
- how water and nutrients are transported around the body.
