

- Research famous people from your area.


Key messages

They should also continue to practice spelling the key exception words for Years 1 and 2 regularly.

Our IPC topic this term is - People of the Past.

In English we will be reading 'Fantastically Great Woman who Changed the World' by Kate Pankhurst and exploring what it takes to be great, and what it was they achieved to be themselves considered great.

We will : -

- Write a Biography and auto-biography, persuasive letter, diary entry and explanations
- Learn how to use expanded noun phrase, conjunctions, apostrophes and subordination.
- Practise writing in the first and third person
- Learn the features and purpose of different text types.

In Maths we will be developing our understanding of We will :-

- Learning about money, recognising symbols for pounds
 (£) and pence (p), combining amounts to make a particular value.
- Finding different combinations of coins that equal the same amount of money
- Multiplication and division, recalling facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times table, learning about odd and even numhers
- Solving problems involving multiplication and division and money in a real life context.

In RE we will be learning about Christianity:

We will be :-

- Christians worship in a church or chapel.
- Prayer and worship is often led by a priest, pastor or minister.
- Sunday is often the special day for worship.
- Everyone is equal and of equal value in the eyes of God

In computing, we will be learning how to train your Robot

We will be :-

- Learning how to follow simple algorithms to control a BeeBot
- Writing our own algorithms to control a BeeBot.

In PE we will be doing Athletics

We will be :-

- mastering basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching,
- developing coordination,
- beginning to apply these in a range of activities

In our History Topic , we will be

We will be :-

- Compare lives of different significant historical figures
- Learn about significant people and events from the local area (Levi Roots) (Mona Baptiste for Windrush - significant local event)
