Dear Parents,

Welcome to our new Reception class. We are excited to be working with you and your child. Our first topic this year is 'All About Me' followed by 'Celebrate good times and good people!' If you have any questions or need support with your child's learning, please speak to a member of the Reception staff.

Important information for the term

Books Bags

Letters for home will be shared via parent-mail, but occasionally letters will go home in your child's book bag together with the school reading book Please check these regularly.

Phonics and Reading

This term we begin our daily phonics lessons. The children will be learning the structure and routine of a phonics lesson. We will teach one sound a day, practising letter recognition and formation

Reading practice

Once the children are blending, we will provide them with a phonics book to teach reading. This book will be changed weekly. First your child will be given a book for you to read to them or a picture book to tell the story.

Reading for pleasure

As well as teaching the skill of reading, we want to encourage a love of reading, To support this, children will bring home a book for parents to read to them. This book for pleasure can be changed when children are ready for a new story.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please make sure all your child's uniform is clearly labelled with their name. Children must also have the correct PE kit, with their PE top the colour of your child's assigned house. The house names and matching colours are: Darwin - yellow; Shakespeare - purple, Nightingale - red, Brunel - green, Pankhurst - blue.

Our PE days are <u>Wednesdays</u>. Please send children into school wearing their PE kit on these days.

Wellington Boots

Reception will have access to the outdoor playground later this term. Please send in a labelled pair of welly boots for your child to wear as they access their outdoor learning. Children will also wear all-in ones to protect their clothes in wet weather:

Snack time and Lunchtime

We provide children with a snack every morning. The lunchtime menu will be shared with your child each day and it would be most appreciated if you could discuss the different food choices with your child beforehand to make their decision for lunch easier. If your child brings in a packed lunch, please ensure there are healthy choices with one small treat (remember we are a nut free school). Children also need a labelled water bottle, this must only contain water.

Understanding of the World

As young explorers, the children will be encouraged to question the world around them, exploring similarities and differences. This term, we will explore Harlow our local area, as well as seasonal changes. The children will also learn more about families and each other.

Mathe

As Mathematicians, we will explore the concepts of sorting, matching and comparing with different objects. Within the environment we will investigate mass and capacity using vocabulary such as heavy, light, full and empty to compare. Children will also continue to develop their knowledge of numbers and counting.

Tapestry

Observations of your child throughout the week will be uploaded to *Tapestry* (our online learning journal) where you can make comments and upload your own observations. We encourage all parents to use *Tapestry* as a form of communication and would love to share what the children are doing both at home and in school. Tapestry Tuesdays will take place each week to share some of the posts from home with the rest of the class.

Writing and Mark Making

As writers, we will encourage a range of mark making activities, including developing pencil grip and teaching letter formation. The children will be encouraged to attribute meaning to their marks and writing. They will be learning how to write their name, as well as learning to write a range of labels, captions and simple words such as 'mot' and 'bug'.

- Please remember that school starts at 8.45 and ends at 3.45
- PE days are on a Wednesday. Please ensure your child comes to school in their PE kits. Children should not be wearing any jewellery including earrings, and long hair must be tied up.
- All hair accessories must be matched to hair colour or in line with uniform, which is blue.
