Thursday	Mathematics test: Paper 3 reasoning

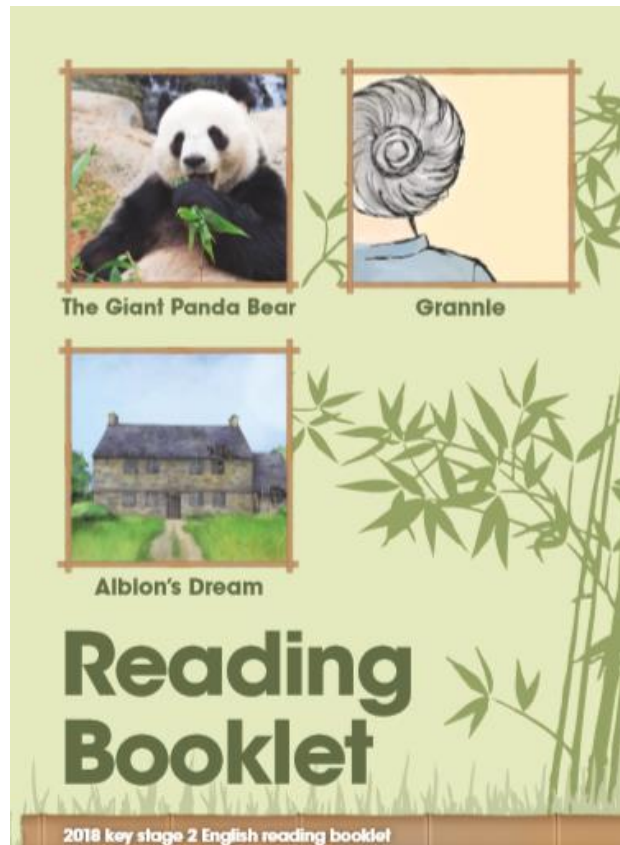

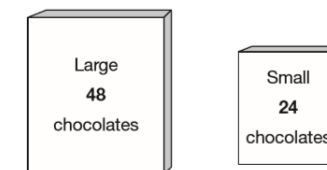
