Some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods • Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality 	<p><u>Lesson 1 – Prior learning/chronology</u> – Cleethorpes on the map, Cleethorpes is by the sea/seaside resort, what people like to do at the seaside, travel by train, car, bus in the past</p> <p><u>Lesson 2/3 Victorian Cleethorpes/ Historical evidence?</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know that people in Victorian times liked to visit the seaside (1837-1901) only the rich though • Know that Victorians travelled to the seaside for holidays by train (Cleethorpes train station built 1863) • Know that the train station changed Cleethorpes into a busy seaside resort • Know that Victorians didn't sunbathe but they did sea bathe fully clothed • Know that Victorians believed the sea air was very good for you • Know that people used trams in the 1890's to travel around Cleethorpes • Know that in the early 1900's tourists travelled around Cleethorpes in Charabancs • Know that Victorians used changing rooms on wheels to get changed to go in the sea at Cleethorpes • Know that Cleethorpes Pier was built (in 1872) Victorian times • Know that in 1903 the concert hall in the Pier burnt down and the new pavilion was built that's still there today • Know that Cleethorpes had a water slide, roller coaster, miniature railway, Punch and Judy Shows and a Helter Skelter <p><u>Lesson 4- Cleethorpes Visit- Any evidence from the past?
