What is the Difference?

The Flu

- Fever (a temperature of 37.8°C or above)
- Muscle and joint pain
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Loss of appetite
- Diarrhoea/ stomach pain (mainly children)
- Fatigue (common)

Covid-19

- Fever (a temperature of 37.8°C or above)
- A new, continuous, dry cough (coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours)
- A loss/ change to your sense of taste/ smell
- Fatigue (sometimes)

The Common Cold

- Runny/ blocked nose
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Muscle ache
- Sneezing
- Chesty cough
- Pressure in ears/ face
- Fever (very rare)
- Fatigue (common)

Allergies

- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Red, itchy, watery eyes
- Wheezing/ coughing
- Red, itchy rash
- Sore/ itchy throat

If you think you have Covid-19, do not send your child to school, attend your GP Practice, Pharmacy or Hospital.

Self-isolate and book a test as soon as possible
