The Creation Story

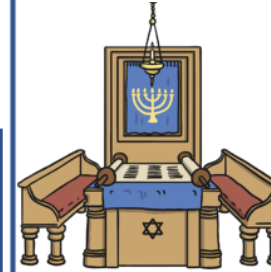


On the first day, God made light ('day') and dark ('night').

 On the seventh day, God rested.

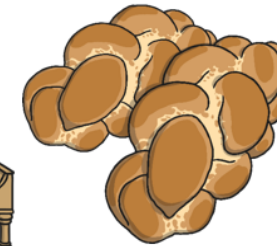
Faith
