

Attendance

- Last year our attendance was terrible, with lots of class regularly below 95%
- Every school day your child will be picking up essential skills to support them in this year, school, further education and life. Each day missed is a gap in their education that won't be filled.
- The doors will be open between 8.45 and 8.50 am. On the rare occasions that you are late please go to the main office
- The school day ends at 3.15pm for Key Stage 1 and 3:20pm for Key Stage 2

<u>Attendance</u>

- If your child will not be at school please ring 02089533459 at the start of the school day to let us know and send in a letter as soon as possible
- No holidays will be authorised during term time and unfortunately, due to our low attendance percentage, we do have to start giving out fixed penalty notices (fines) if your child has more than 15 half days (7 ½ days) of unauthorised absence within 2 terms. The fine is £60 per parent per child.

Uniform


Children must wear correct school uniform each day unless otherwise told.


This consists of:

If there is a valid reason that your child cannot be in the proper uniform please inform the adults in writing at the start of the day.






PE Kits


PE Kits consist of:


- Trainers or plimsolls

- Please ensure all clothing has your child's name on!




Please clearly label everything that belongs to your child with their name – it is amazing how quickly things disappear!

Rewards and Sanctions

If a child does not improve negative behaviour after a warning then there will be consequences to help them to adapt their behaviour.

This will be wherever possible directly related to the inappropriate behaviour - for example

- If they make a mess they will be expected to clean it up
- If they refuse to work in lessons they will need to catch up in their own time
- They may need a short time out of the room, or need to work by themselves within the classroom

We will report any significant tricky behaviour to you

Reading

- Please ensure your child practises their reading as much as possible. We ask the children to read a minimum of three times a week or they will be kept in to read during their own time.
- It must be an adult that signs the reading diaries.
- Books will be checked and changed on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- This year we will be sending out a library book with their home reading book – please share and enjoy this book together.
- If you have any time and would like to volunteer to hear readers or help with the library we would love to hear from you!

<u>Homework</u>

- We will be giving out homework grids at the start of each half term.
- Each week your child chooses one square on the grid and completes the task. You need to sign that square.
- Each half term one square will be called 'Family Time' which allows you to complete family activities.
- The homework grids must be handed in every Friday for the teachers to check/mark.
- In order to prepare children for life in secondary school, there will be sanctions for late homework
- We are also preparing a guidance sheet for those of you who would like to further support your children.

Year 4 Multiplication Check

- At the end of Year 4, all of the children complete a multiplication check.
- This check consists of a timed test of 25 questions, to be completed using a computer.
- This means that the children will be being tested on their multiplication and computer skills.
- The children will have 6 six seconds to give their answer –
 that is 6 seconds to recall the answer and type it in the
 box. Then a 3 second pause between questions.
- They will be given more questions from the 6,7,8,9 and 12 times tables then the others, although there will be a range. No two tests will be the same and they will not have reversals within one test.

Expectations

By the end of Year 3, the children should know the 2x, 5x, 10x, 3x, 4x and 8x table.

They should then be ready to learn the 6x, 7x, 9x, 11x and 12x tables in year 4.

If your child finds learning times tables difficult then please come and ask for advice. The more practise they get, the easier they will find them.

Securing times tables

- If a child is completely secure in their times tables knowledge, they are also able to use the associated division facts quickly,
- E.g. if $5 \times 2 = 10$ then $10 \div 5 = 2$

Practise In School...

- Within the curriculum the children are taught strategies for learning the times tables.
- However, without constant practise these times tables disappear from our brains!
- This year we are launching times tables rockstars, an app that is designed to help children learn their tables and succeed at quick recall.
- There are also lots of ideas for practise in your handouts.
