Teachers can encourage children to reflect on the importance of democracy and participation in decision-making, both locally and globally.</p>	<p>The Primary MFL Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about the laws and regulations of other countries and cultures, as well as the importance of following rules and respecting authority. Children can learn about different legal systems, such as the Napoleonic Code in France, or cultural practices that reflect the rule of law, such as the importance of punctuality in German culture. Teachers can promote this value by emphasizing the importance of following rules and laws, both at home and in other cultures.</p>	<p>The Primary MFL Curriculum emphasizes the importance of personal expression and communication. Children can learn how to express themselves in another language and how to communicate with people from different cultures. Teachers can encourage children to explore their own interests and passions in other languages, and to appreciate the diversity of cultural expression.</p>	<p>The Primary MFL Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about and appreciate different cultures and beliefs through language learning. Children can learn about different cultural practices and beliefs, as well as the similarities and differences between different languages and cultures. Teachers can promote mutual respect by encouraging children to engage with and learn from others with different backgrounds and perspectives. The Primary MFL Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about and appreciate different religions and beliefs through language learning. Children can learn about religious vocabulary and cultural practices, as well as the importance of respecting and tolerating different beliefs. Teachers can promote this value by incorporating activities and resources that highlight different religious and cultural practices, and by encouraging children to engage with and learn from others with different beliefs and perspectives.</p>
