The RE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about how different religions and cultures make decisions and participate in democratic processes. For example, they can learn about the role of religious leaders in decision-making or the importance of community involvement in religious practices. Teachers can encourage children to reflect on the importance of democracy and participation in decision-making, both locally and globally.	The RE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about the laws and regulations of different religions and cultures, as well as the importance of following rules and respecting authority. Children can learn about different legal systems, such as the Sharia law in Islam or the Ten Commandments in Judaism and Christianity. Teachers can promote this value by emphasizing the importance of following rules and laws, both at home and in other cultures.	The RE Curriculum emphasizes the importance of personal expression and beliefs. Children can learn about different religious beliefs and practices and how they relate to personal expression and identity. Teachers can encourage children to explore their own beliefs and values and to appreciate the diversity of religious expression.	The Primary RE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about and appreciate different religions and beliefs. Children can learn about different cultural practices and beliefs, as well as the similarities and differences between different religions. Teachers can promote mutual respect by encouraging children to engage with and learn from others with different religious backgrounds and perspectives.  The RE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about and appreciate different religions and beliefs, and to develop tolerance and understanding of those who hold different beliefs. Teachers can promote this value by incorporating activities and resources that highlight different religious and cultural practices, and by encouraging children to engage with and learn from others with different beliefs and perspectives. Children can also learn about the importance of respect and tolerance towards those with different beliefs and backgrounds, and how to demonstrate this in their daily lives.
