They can explore different forms of democracy, such as voting and representation, and how these processes promote equality and fairness. Teachers can encourage children to participate in class discussions and decision-making, and to understand the importance of listening to and respecting the views of others.	The PSHE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about the laws and regulations that govern society and how they help to maintain order and protect individuals. Children can learn about the importance of following rules and laws, and how breaking them can have consequences. Teachers can promote this value by encouraging children to understand and follow rules and laws, and by highlighting the importance of respect for authority and the role of the justice system.	The PSHE Curriculum emphasizes the importance of personal expression and respect for others. Children can learn about the importance of respecting the rights and freedoms of others, and how to express their own views and opinions in a respectful and constructive manner. Teachers can encourage children to develop a sense of self-awareness and to understand the importance of personal autonomy and self-expression.	The PSHE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about and appreciate the diversity of society, including different cultures, beliefs, and identities. Children can learn about the importance of respect for others, regardless of their differences, and how to promote equality and fairness in their daily lives. Teachers can promote mutual respect by encouraging children to understand and appreciate the perspectives of others, and by creating an inclusive and supportive classroom environment. The PSHE Curriculum provides opportunities for children to learn about different cultures and religions, and to develop empathy and understanding for those with different beliefs and values. Children can learn about the importance of tolerance and respect for diversity, and how to challenge prejudice and discrimination. Teachers can promote this value by incorporating activities and resources that highlight different cultural practices and beliefs, and by encouraging children to engage with and learn from others with different backgrounds and perspectives.
