First Aid in School		

We have made a few changes to our First Aid Policy recently after an incident on the playground involving a fractured leg. From now on we will contact parents if we feel that they need to decide to have any injury checked by a medical professional for example a GP or at Accident and Emergency (not just a head injury). This may be when there is no obvious signs of a serious injury but the child is still saying they are in pain after being checked. We will ask you if you are available to come to school yourself but if you are unavailable, we will monitor the injury and if we feel it is worsening, we will make the decision to call you again or call an ambulance if you are unavailable.

You may have noticed that Mrs Hutabarat, one of our TAs and Welfare staff, has been absent from school since returning in September. Unfortunately she is in hospital quite poorly at the moment. We are in contact with her and we wish her a speedy recovery. Governor Election

Unfortunately, we did not receive any nominations for the vacant position of parent governor. We will repeat the process after the Christmas break. Hopefully, this will give parents time to think about whether this will be something they are interested in.

Anti-Bullying Week

We will be taking part in Anti-Bullying Week this year which begins on 15th November. Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event which aims to raise awareness of bullying and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. In England, Anti-Bullying Week is organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is a network of more than 100 member organisations all united against bullying. This year the theme is 'One Kind Word', emphasising the positive impact a small gesture or comment can have on someone else's day. We will be kicking off the week with Odd Sock Day. This day helps us to recognise that everyone is unique and different, and that we all need kindness and respect. If your child wishes to take part, they just have to wear a pair of odd socks (over tights if girls wish to). This is NOT a non-uniform day. Normal uniform should be worn.

Children in Need

This year Children in Need is on 19th November which coincides with the end of our Anti-Bullying Week. This will be a non-uniform day and the children can come to school in Children in Need themed clothing or something spotty if they wish for a minimum donation of £1.

This should be paid via Parent Pay.

This year Oak Class will be performing a Nativity performance that will be recorded for parents as we did last year. We managed to raise some money from this by parents making danations to receive a link to download the video to keep.
