
## **Around the School**



This week in computing, Foxes have begun a new unit all about data. Exploring what data is, they used a map of zoo animals to create groups and discussed different ways to record each number. After being introduced to tally charts, they used this technique to represent the zoo data and shared their work with others to compare

This week in science, squirrels have started their new unit all about everyday materials. The children had to recognise and name different everyday materials including metal, wood, plastic, cloth and paper. Then, they had to describe the properties of these materials using new vocabulary such as opaque, absorbent and waterproof.
