

Red 2 Blue

At KPS, one of our aims is to help our children to be personally successful. We do a lot of work with our children to help their personal development. Every day, our pupils come into school and have 121 time with their teacher to scale how they are feeling. This daily dialogue helps our children to feel recognised, to develop their social and emotional language and it also helps our teacher to triage and address any worries or concerns they may have, putting immediate support into place. We use Zumos to help us do this, which all children have access to at home. We also promote personal development through our curriculum, focussed

assemblies and through our restorative approach to managing behaviour.

This year, we have focussed on helping children to self-regulate, so that they recognise strategies they can use to help them to regulate their emotions. Across the school, we are launching our new 'Red 2 Blue' approach to support pupils' emotional wellbeing and self-regulation. This is an approach that has been launched across The Shaw Education Trust family.



As part of our safeguarding agenda within school, we want to broaden and enable both parents and pupils to have 'A VOICE'.

Please could you click on the following link and complete the application to see if your child is eligible for free school meals.

If your child is eligible this will entitle your child to free school meals, the free holiday clubs, food vouchers during the school holidays etc.

Once completed (and if eligible) if you can print a copy of the confirmation page off and return back to the school office this will then allow the free school meals to start immediately.

If you are unable to print you can still make your application online, but you will need to wait for Staffordshire county council to advise us before you can start to receive the free school meals.

Swimming

Since 1994, swimming and water safety has been a statutory element of the national curriculum for Physical Activity in England. Swimming is the only sport to be included within the national curriculum physical education programme of study.

ALL PRIMARY SCHOOLS MUST PROVIDE SWIMMING AND WATER SAFETY LESSONS IN EITHER KEY STAGE 1 OR 2. But we are providing this to everyone!

How does it work?

Filtered, heated pool on the school Grounds (KS2 playground)

Qualified swimming teachers & Lifeguards

The pool is 32 x 16 ft - 55,000 litres - filtered - heated between 26-32 degrees and covered with a secure marquee.

All children must wear a swimming cap. If you don't have on you can purchase them for £3 on the day.

We will have separate spaces in school for the boys and girls to get changed for their lessons. Please bring flip flops / Crocs for the covered walk to the pool.

Pupils will receive a 30 minutes daily intense lessons in small ability groups.

To enable us to cover the costs and it become part of our yearly offer, please can you pay your £15 via ParentPay ASAP. We thank you for your continued support.
